

STUDENTS POLICY 5131.4

ALCOHOL, DRUGS, AND CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

~~It will be the policy of Campbell County School District that no student will be allowed on the school premises or on a school sponsored activity and while on said premises or activity:~~

- ~~1. Have in possession any alcoholic beverage, drug, or any substance prohibited by the controlled substances Acts of 1971.~~
- ~~2. Use, be under the influence of, or have in the blood stream any alcohol, drug, non-personal prescription medication, or any substance prohibited by the Controlled Substance Act of 1971.~~
- ~~3. Will possess, dispense or in any way transfer possession of an alcoholic beverages, drugs, prescription medication, or any substance prohibited by the Controlled substances Act of 1971.~~
 - ~~a. Any violation involving drugs that are illegal for all persons to possess will result in an automatic 10 day suspension and an expulsion hearing before the Board of Trustees.~~
 - ~~b. Any violation involving other substances will result in an automatic 10 day suspension and penalties as specified in other policies and may result in an expulsion hearing.~~
 - ~~c. Any second violation in any one school year of any portion of the policy will result on an automatic 10 day suspension plus an expulsion hearing before the Board of Trustees.~~

The possession, distribution or use of alcoholic beverages, tobacco, drugs for which the user does not have a lawful prescription, or substances which are used in such a manner as to be dangerous to the student in any school building, on school grounds, at any school function, or while on any school sponsored trip is prohibited. Students are prohibited from being in any school building, on school grounds, or at any school function while under the influence of alcohol, drugs or substances.

Any student suspected of being under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or other substance or whose immediate prior use of alcohol, drugs or other substance is suspected may be removed from the classroom, school building, school grounds, or school function pending further investigation. Students may be suspended or expelled for violation of the prohibition of alcohol, tobacco, drugs or other substances.

The reference herein to "other substance" is intended to prohibit the use, possession or distribution, including smoking, huffing, inhaling, consuming, absorbing or

otherwise ingesting for the purpose of generating a high or rush, or otherwise altering the mental processing or impairing the consumer's judgment or motor skills, or for use contrary to the lawful and intended use of the substance. Such substances include, but are not limited to, glue, paint, Dust-off, petroleum products, "spice", "K-2", "Black Mamba", "Puff", "Sugar Sticks", herbal incense, Salvia Divinorum, Salvinorum A, or any other substance, whether organic or non-organic, which substances are utilized in such a manner as to create a high or rush or otherwise alter the mental processing or impair the consumer's judgment or motor skills or in such a way as to be contrary to their intended use or purpose. It is also prohibited to have in the student's possession, be under the influence of, or have in the student's blood stream any intoxicant, inhalant (not intended for that specific purpose or need) or any substance represented by the student to be a "drug" as defined by this policy. In addition, it is prohibited for a student to possess "drug paraphernalia" as defined by the Wyoming Controlled Substances Act 1971. It is the policy of the District that the possession, use or distribution of substances represented as drugs is detrimental to the education, safety, and welfare of students.

To help students who are identified as abusing alcohol/drugs/substances, District and community resources will be available to work toward overcoming this illegal use of tobacco, alcohol, drugs or substances. Students may self-refer or be remanded to such District and community resource providers. The responsibility of correcting an identified problem is that of the student and his/her parent(s).

The District will develop programs to educate students to bring about awareness and understanding of the dangers inherent in the use/abuse of alcohol, tobacco, controlled drugs, or other substances.

The District will provide counseling service that will make it possible for students to seek and obtain counseling for drugs/substances and/or alcohol-related problems or will provide counseling as to where appropriate help can be received.

Definitions

Alcoholic Beverages--Any Alcoholic liquor or malt beverage as defined by Wyoming statutes.

Tobacco--Any of a genus (Nicotiana) of chiefly American Plants of the nightshade family with viscid foliage and tubular flowers. The leaves of such plants are normally used and marketed for smoking, chewing, or as snuff.

Drug--Any controlled substance as defined by Wyoming statutes.

Drug paraphernalia--Drug paraphernalia means all equipment, products and materials of any kind when used, advertised for use, intended for use or designed for use for manufacturing, converting, preparing, packaging, repackaging, storing, containing, concealing, injecting, ingesting, inhaling or otherwise introducing into the human body a controlled substance in violation of this act and includes:

- (A) **Isomerization devices when used, advertised for use, intended for use or designed for use in increasing the potency of any species of plant which is a controlled substance;**
- (B) **Quinine hydrochloride, mannitol and mannite when used, advertised for use, intended for use or designed for use in diluting controlled substances;**
- (C) **Separation gins and sifters when used or advertised for use in removing twigs and seeds from or in otherwise cleaning or refining marihuana;**
- (D) **Objects when used, advertised for use, intended for use or designed for use in injecting controlled substances into the human body;**
- (E) **The following objects when used, advertised for use, intended for use or designed for use in ingesting, inhaling or otherwise introducing marihuana, cocaine, hashish or hashish oil or any other controlled substance into the human body:**
 - (I) **Metal, acrylic, glass, stone, plastic or ceramic pipes with or without screens, permanent screens, hashish heads or punctured metal bowls;**
 - (II) **Carburetion tubes;**
 - (III) **Carburetion masks;**
 - (IV) **Chamber pipes;**
 - (V) **Carburetor pipes;**
 - (VI) **Electric pipes;**
 - (VII) **Air-driven pipes;**
 - (VIII) **Chillums;**
 - (IX) **Bongs;**
 - (X) **Ice pipes or chillers.**

Substance--Any substance, whether organic, or non-organic, which can be smoked, huffed, inhaled, consumed, absorbed, or otherwise ingested for the purpose of generating a high or rush, or otherwise altering the mental processing, or impairing the consumer's judgment or motor skills, or for the use contrary to the lawful and intended use of the substance, excluding any substance taken pursuant to a lawful medical prescription or which is used in the manner in which it is intended to be used for a legitimate medical or healthy condition. The term substance includes, but is not limited to glue, paint, Dust-Off, petroleum products, "spice", "K-2", "Black Mamba", "Puff", "Sugar sticks", herbal incense, Salvia Divinorum or Salvinorum A.

Drug or Substance Trafficking/Providing--Any involvement in the process of delivery or actual delivery of a drug/substance or any substance delivered or in the process of

being delivered which is represented by the trafficker to be a drug or substance as defined in this policy.

In-School Suspension--Suspension within the regular school day. This entails supervision and isolation at a designated room in the school building, Students are allowed to work on homework and assignments while in the in-school suspension environment.

Possession--Any exercise of control or dominion.

Suspected--Reasonable suspicion (Based on observations and/or information received which would lead a reasonable person to believe that the student has violated or is violating this policy).

Under the influence--Ingestion of alcoholic beverage or dangerous/illegal drug or substance affecting any physical or mental capacity/ability.
