

Campbell County School District Board of Trustees Special Dinner Meeting  
Tuesday, March 27, 2018, at 5:15 pm

Dr. Brown listed the topics that would be presented at the meeting: 1) Opportunity for board members to ask questions regarding items on the Consent Agenda, 2) Board Committee Reports, 3) Elementary STEM Lab Updates, and 4) Alternative Calendars at Rural Schools.

Elementary STEM Lab Updates – Elementary principals and technology teachers and facilitators from the elementary schools who received STEM Labs this year gave an update on how those labs are being used. The STEM Lab schedules from each school were shared and different projects being worked on by students in each grade level were highlighted. In addition to STEM learning, students are learning teamwork, problem solving, and critical thinking skills. The board and administrators were given an opportunity to work on a sample assignment. The group shared with the board that although all STEM Lab activities match up with the standards, integration into the curriculum will not be possible until all elementary schools have the labs. A video was shared with the board which showed students working on various projects.

Alternative School Calendars – Dr. Brown shared the Rules and Regulation relating to school alternative schedules and reported that Westwood High School currently has an alternative schedule. Wright Junior/Senior High School, Cottonwood Elementary, Little Powder School, Recluse School, and 4J School are interested in potentially looking into the possibility of alternate schedules. Dr. Brown explained that he was looking for guidance from the board regarding alternate schedules at the interested schools. There is support to begin exploring the possibility of alternate schedules.

Consent Agenda Questions – There were no questions regarding Consent Agenda items.

Board Committee Reports: Mrs. Hladky and Mrs. Bell reported that they attended the district crisis drill at Campbell County High School. They found the drill to be very interesting. They commented that they were amazed at how smoothly the drill went and were impressed with how well everyone worked together.
