

Campbell County School District Board of Trustees Special Dinner Meeting  
Tuesday, April 10, 2018, at 5:15 pm

Dr. Brown listed the topics that would be presented at the meeting: 1) Opportunity for board members to ask questions regarding items on the Consent Agenda, 2) Board Committee Reports, 3) GIS Presentation, 4) Summer School Update, and 5) Graduation Attendance and Speakers.

Consent Agenda Questions – There were no questions regarding Consent Agenda items.

Board Committee Reports – There were no board committee reports.

GIS Presentation – Annie Mayfield with the City of Gillette presented information on the Geographical Information System (GIS) used by the City of Gillette. The GIS contains about 50 datasets and approximately 1000 layers and tables. The GIS is able to provide real-time data to aid with decision making and efficiency.

Summer School Update – Brian Knox, Brandon Crosby, Stephanie Zickefoose, and Jason Garman provided an update on the elementary summer school program to be held this summer. Changes at the elementary level will include a shortened day from 5 hours to 3.5 hours. Math Camp, science, physical activity, and technology labs will be discontinued. The schedule will continue with a four day week; however, teacher contract days will be reduced from 18 days to 13 days.

Elementary students invited to attend summer school will be based on teacher referral rather than MAP scores. Extended School Year (ESY) summer school attendance will be based on a student's Individual Education Plan (IEP). Summer school will not be offered to students in sixth through eighth grade unless they have an IEP. Extra instructional services for junior high students will be offered during the regular school year through before and after school programs.

Secondary summer school will be housed at Thunder Basin High School this year. The certified PE teacher positions have been eliminated, and instead, physical activity for secondary students during summer school will be provided by educational support personnel.

The changes in summer school provide an estimated \$500,000 in cost savings for the district.
